K.Clark suggested it might be an idea to make the 'draw-time' for the river Monday night matches slightly earlier and it was agreed this would now be set at 5.45pm.

There was then a general conversation regarding the national problems with cormorant predation and the membership were reminded of the importance of reporting all sightings to the Hydroscape online survey.

Fisheries Officers Report 22/3/26.

Another busy year where I have spent around 300hrs on the routine fishery management. All routine maintenance has been carried out as required (and when weather has permitted!) and I have held several work parties for larger projects.

The island upgrades are definitely paying dividends as they are now looking much better, and this will continue as necessary.

On top of all this for the last 6 months I have also been involved with a large-scale revamp of all the platforms on Centenary and Willow, started by myself and Ky, and continuing with help from Ky's son Iwan and my son Tom, and these are now more or less completed, with just some groundworks required, when time allows, to ensure ease of access for our less mobile members.

Thanks to all who have helped throughout the last year, as usual I shan't try to name everyone in case I forget someone and cause offence, but a massive thumbs up to all who turn up and help on work parties or when I need an extra pair of hands, it really is appreciated.

I will, however, specifically mention Dave Grice and Nigel Lale, without whom I couldn't achieve half of what needs doing, and to Paul Kitchen who I keep busy mending things as I break them - all their help is invaluable.

Thanks too to Justin who has helped check memberships at the lakes and kept an eye on the juniors, Neil who monitors the trailcams, to Keiran who helps when chainsaw work is required, to all the pest control operatives who are often around when most of us are still tucked up in bed and who work tirelessly dissuading our unwanted visitors, to Will, Mark and Dax who are always happy to help especially when boat work is required and Roger who consistently keeps an eye on water quality throughout the summer months and who also keeps us on our toes with H+S matters.

Cedric keeps the birds fed all winter and puts up two dozen nest boxes all summer and finally to Russ, Gerald n Paul for all their help and advice when I find myself confused, which can happen!.

Apologies if I have forgotten anyone specific!.

As you know the stock fish in Swan both breed and survive prolifically, to the point of the lake being detrimentally overcrowded, so the harvest has continued, although somewhat slowly this year due to the prolonged hot weather. Myself and Dave built a new larger holding net for the purpose which has worked terrifically well resulting in 200lb of homegrown pristine commons being relocated to Centenary and Willow and half a dozen larger fish to Kingfisher and Kestrel. Obviously this harvest of 'free stock' will continue.

To maintain and slowly increase the stocking levels of Kestrel we have purchased 15 off c5 mirror carp, and to improve the winter fishing in Centenary and Willow we also purchased 300lb of bream, which have settled in very well, together with ordering another batch of F1s for next Winter delivery.

Once again we have made 1000 litres of barley straw extract, saving around £1500, used to improve the water quality of Kestrel, Kingfisher, Centenary and Willow.

Centenary and Willow were also treated with salt to improve stock health and we continue with adding dye to Kingfisher, Mallard and Coot to help inhibit weed growth. Anecdotally it appears dye may also deter cormorants so this may be expanded to include Centenary and Willow this year.

Swan, Kestrel, Centenary and Willow were again topped up with feed pellets weekly with definite signs of fish growth and improved fishing and this will continue.

We have also created a nice quiet 'Garden of Rest' area where members whom we have lost can have their ashes laid, together with a small remembrance plaque, should they wish. Several families have already taken this opportunity.

Gerald has been busy looking after all things river with all mowing, strimming and tree work completed as required.

Prior to the start of the season Ky repaired the lanes at the Jolly Barge and a section of Westfield Lane, which as usual will need revisiting during the close season, together with fitting a new gate and building an access ramp to improve access from the Weir Field hard standing.

The bank top at the 20s has been reseeded and is currently being left to re-establish, and the conveyor has now gone giving room for an extra peg.

Gerald has asked me, on his behalf, to thank all those who have helped, and in particular to mention Paul Kitchen, Paul Thomas, Ky and Iwan.

So there we are, a busy year behind us and another one ahead, and as we speak the grass is starting to grow!. Do remember how much goes on behind the scenes maintaining our fantastic facilities and do enjoy the quality fishing our club offers. Tight lines everyone.

TREASURERS REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31<sup>st</sup> DECEMBER 2025.

INCOME.

A VERY HEALTHY YEAR FOR THE ASSOCIATION FINANCIALLY WITH OVERALL INCOME INCREASING BY SLIGHTLY IN EXCESS OF 25 %. ADDITIONAL RECEIPTS FROM TEMPORARY MEMBERSHIPS OF £14626, TOGETHER WITH A GAIN IN SUBSCRIPTIONS OF £5248 FORMED THE BULK OF THE INCREASE.

EXPENDITURE.

THERE HAS HOWEVER, BEEN AN INCREASE IN EXPENDITURE OVER LAST YEAR OF APPROX. 15%.

THIS INCREASE IS MORER THAN COVERED BY PURCHASES, TOTALLING £9190 FOR ASSETS WHICH WILL BENEFIT THE ASSOCIATION IN THE LONG TERM. THE PURCHASE OF THE DIESEL TANK HAS ALLOWED THE PURCHASED OF STOCKS OF FUEL AT SIGNIFICANT SAVINGS (50%+) - A PARTICULARLY GOOD MOVE IN THE CURRENT CLIMATE.

WORK HAS BEEN CARRIED OUT ON THE PLATFORMS ON THE MATCH LAKES AND £5500 HAS BEEN SPENT ON RESTOCKING.

WE FINISHED THE YEAR WITH A SURPLUS OF £22479.49
